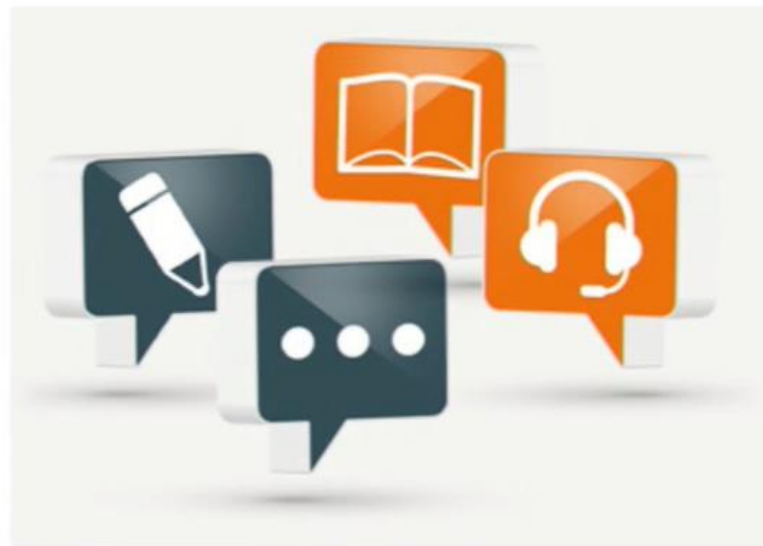
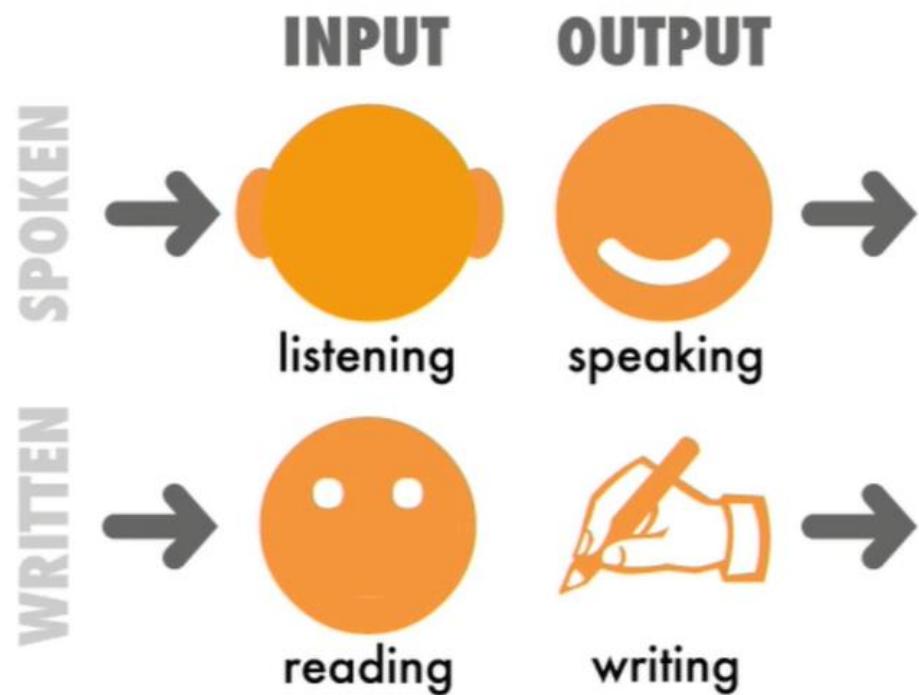

Health and Safety Executive (HSE) fully endorses the recommendation in Common Sense, Common Safety that individual firefighters should not be at risk of investigation or prosecution, under health and safety law, if they have put themselves at risk as a result of a heroic act.

Striking the balance between operational and health and safety duties in the fire and rescue service recognises the particularly challenging nature of fire and rescue activity and the extremely dangerous environments in which firefighters have to work. It explains how fire and rescue services can comply with health and safety duties while delivering an effective operational service.

The statement makes it clear that fire and rescue services need to manage all foreseeable risk effectively and to review their operational procedures in the light of experience.

It also sets out the duty of individual firefighters, to co-operate with their officers, take reasonable care of themselves, and not endanger others. This means that firefighters should act sensibly and responsibly within the command and control of their officers; they should not act recklessly.

It is also important to recognise that firefighters should not be expected to put themselves at unreasonable risk, even in the face of sometimes unrealistic public expectations.

The HSE views the actions of firefighters as truly heroic when it is clear that they have decided to act entirely of their own volition in putting themselves at risk to protect the public or colleagues and there have been no orders or other directions from senior officers to do so and when their actions have not put other firefighters at similar high risk.

In those rare cases when a firefighter does perform an act of heroism, it is only right that the Fire and Rescue Service may sometimes recognise and commend them for their bravery.

Human beings have been fighting each other since prehistoric times, and people have been discussing the rights and wrongs of it for almost as long.

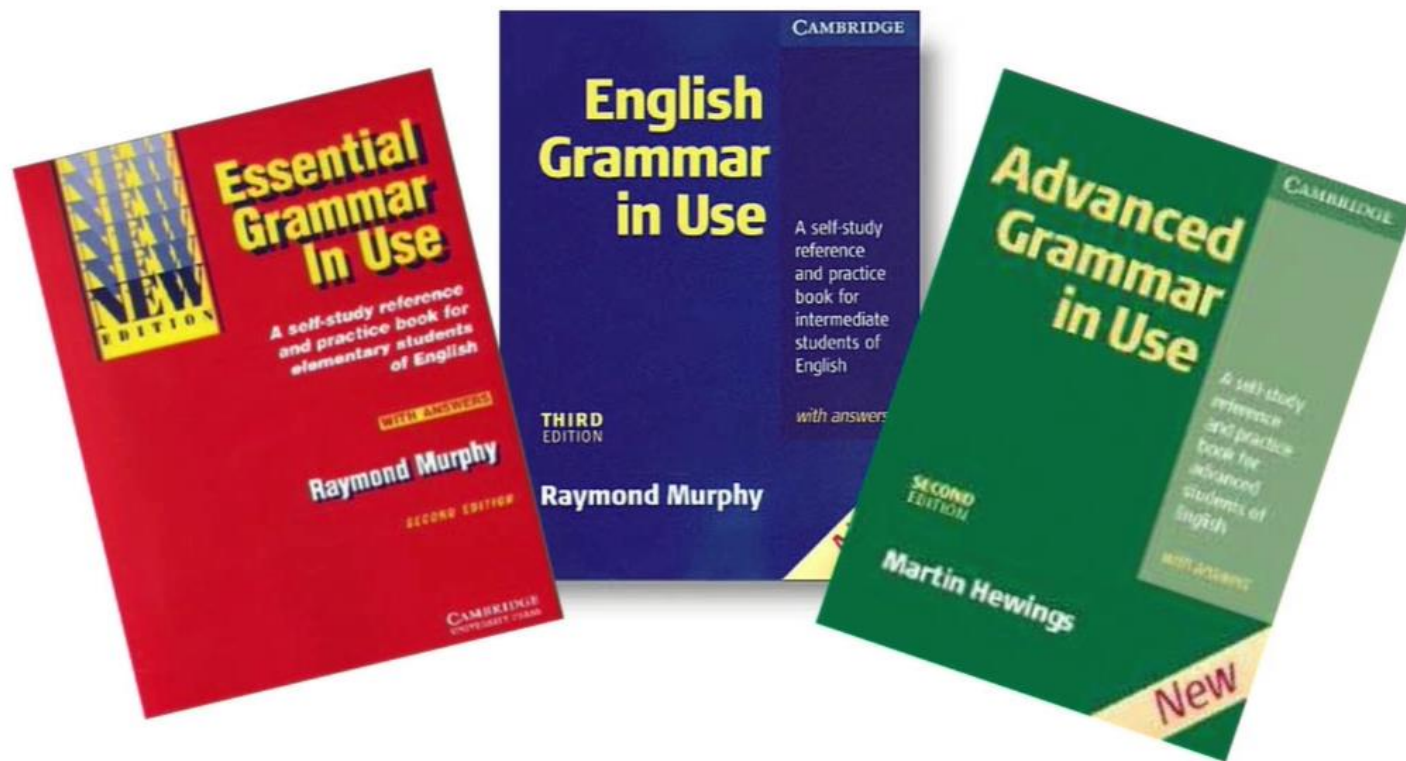
The Ethics of War starts by assuming that war is a bad thing, and should be avoided if possible, but it recognizes that there can be situations when war may be the lesser evil of several bad choices. War is a bad thing because it involves deliberately killing or injuring people, and this is a fundamental wrong – an abuse of the victims human rights.

The purpose of war ethics is to help decide what is right or wrong, both for individuals and countries, and to contribute to debates on public policy, and ultimately to government and individual action. War ethics also leads to the creation of formal codes of war (e.g. the Hague and Geneva conventions), the drafting and implementation of rules of engagement for soldiers, and in the punishment of soldiers and others for war crimes. The three key questions are:

Is it ever right to go to war? When is it right to fight? What is the moral way to conduct a war? The discussion of the ethics of war goes back to the Greeks and Romans, although neither civilization behaved particularly well in war. In the Christian tradition war ethics were developed by St Augustine, and later by St Thomas Aquinas and others.

Hugo Grotius (1583-1645), a Dutch philosopher and author of *De Jure Belli Ac Pacis* (The Rights of War and Peace), wrote down the conditions for a just war that are accepted today. Cicero argued that there was no acceptable reason for war outside of just revenge or self-defence – in which he included the defence of honor. He also argued that a war could not be just unless it was publicly declared and unless compensation for the enemy's offence had first been demanded. Cicero based his argument on the assumption that nature and human reason influenced a society against war, and that there was a fundamental code of behavior for nations.

A plane with 58 people on board took off at an airport in Taipei, but it crashed just minutes afterwards.

A **dashboard** camera in a car filmed the moments before the crash. In the video, the plane misses apartment buildings by metres. Then it **tilts** to one side and hits an **overpass** with its wing.

The plane then crashes into a river. At least 19 people die and 15 people have injuries in the accident. Twenty-four people are still missing.

Difficult words: **dashboard** (the area in front of the driver in a car), **tilt** (to move), **overpass** (a road above the ground).

This amateur video shot from the **dashboard** of a car recorded the moment the TransAsia plane **clipped an overpass** with its wing and crashed into a river in Taipei.

At least 19 people have been killed after the passenger jet

crashed minutes after take-off.
The TransAsia ATN 72-600 plane with 58 people on board was on a **domestic** flight when it hit a road bridge in the capital of Taiwan.

The moment of **impact** was captured on this passing driver's **dashcam** and shows the aircraft's wing clipping a taxi before it disappears out view.

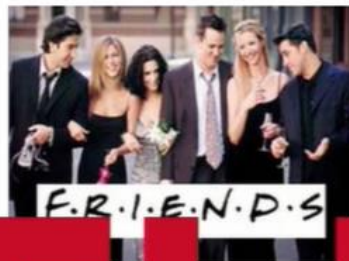
The plane also appears to miss apartment buildings by metres.

The **footage** shows a van **skidding** to a **halt** on the damaged overpass after barely missing the plane's wing with small pieces of the aircraft **scattered** along the road.

Taiwan Civil Aeronautics administration said 19 people were confirmed dead, fifteen were injured and 24 still missing.
